Training as a carer Assistant (m/f/d)

Duration of training

18 months

Training allowance

Your apprenticeship allowance is:

In the 1st year of the apprenticeship: approximately €1,415 gross

In the second year of the apprenticeship: approximately €1,470 gross (last 6 months)

Where available, we offer our apprentices accommodation in one of the two **training shared flats** if required. Please let us know if you need this.

Minimum requirements

- Nine years of general schooling, culminating in a secondary school leaving certificate at the end of Year 9.

Funding from the Employment Agency or the Jobcentre under the Qualification Opportunities Act for retraining is also available, provided the individual meets the relevant personal criteria.

Important to know

- **Three months before the start of your apprenticeship**, you must submit an extended criminal record certificate (NE) with no entries and a medical certificate confirming your fitness to practise the profession within the company.
- You will gain an insight into **various areas of care**. You will complete the 18-month practical vocational training programme at our company. The theoretical training takes place at the relevant vocational school.
- **You must also apply** for a training place at one of the vocational schools listed opposite. This is required for your training with us.
- Students at the Diakonie Akademie and the Pflegeschule apm will receive a **tablet** from us for the duration of their training. Both schools are digitised.

Additional requirements for foreign applicants

- **Proof of German language proficiency** at a level of at least B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is required. This must not be more than one year old if a visa is required.
- You must apply for a **visa** in person at the relevant German embassy in your home country. If a visa is required, you must not have reached the age of 35.
- The **fast-track procedure for skilled workers** must be handled through us as your employer. This will result in **non-reimbursable costs** for you. For your own protection, please ensure you are fully informed in advance about the amount of these costs.

Training content

Fundamentals of nursing care: Caring for, supporting and looking after people of all ages.

Personal care and nutrition: Assisting with daily personal care, dressing and undressing, and eating.

Recording basic medical data: Measuring vital signs such as blood pressure, pulse, temperature and blood sugar.

Therapeutic care: Carrying out tasks such as subcutaneous injections (e.g. insulin), administering eye drops, changing dressings and positioning patients.

Health promotion: Promoting independence and rehabilitation.

Communication and documentation: Professional communication with those in need of care, relatives and within the team, as well as documentation of the measures carried out.

Legal framework: Knowledge of health and safety at work, hygiene regulations and one's own limits of competence.

The training concludes with a state examination comprising a written, an oral and a practical component.

¹ An outpatient care service visits people in their own homes and provides care there.

² In a dementia shared accommodation scheme – or 'dementia shared flat' for short – people living with dementia live together. 'Dementia' means that people are progressively losing their memories and abilities. Everyone has their own room with their own furniture and mementos, but there is also a communal kitchen, balcony/terrace and garden for everyone to share. In their day-to-day lives, they are supported by care staff. The nursing tasks are carried out by Talpflege carers.
