Training as a carer (m/f/d)

Has caring always been your thing? Would you like to choose a career that is meaningful and will give you the feeling that you are needed every day? Then training as a carer could be just the thing for you.

Duration of training

3 years

If you have successfully completed training in assistant and helper occupations in the care sector, the duration of training can be shortened following an examination.

Training allowance

Since the introduction of standardised collective agreement wages, training to become a carer has been among the **best-paid training programmes** in Germany.

Your training allowance is

In the 1st year of training: approx. € 1,490 gross

In the 2nd year of training: approx. € 1,550 gross

In the 3rd year of training: approx. € 1,650 gross

Where available, we offer our trainees accommodation in one of the two **training shared flats** if required. Please let us know if you need this.

Minimum requirements

- A secondary school leaving certificate such as the Fachoberschulreife (FOR) or higher,
- ten years of general schooling culminating in a Hauptschulabschluss (Year 10),
- a nine-year Hauptschulabschluss combined with a recognised one-year nursing assistant training course,
- another completed two-year vocational training course.

Important to know

- **Three months before the start of the training**, you must submit an unadulterated extended criminal record certificate (NE) and a medical certificate authorising you to practise the profession within the company.
- You will gain an understanding of **various areas of care**. You will complete the three-year vocational training not only within our company, but also at other care providers. This makes this apprenticeship particularly varied.
- **You must also apply** for a training place at one of the vocational schools listed opposite. This is required for your training with us.
- Students at the Diakonie Akademie and the Pflegeschule apm will receive a **tablet** from us for the duration of their training. Both schools are digitised.

Additional requirements for foreign applicants

- **Proof of German language proficiency** at level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is required. This must not be more than one year old if a visa is required.
- You must apply for a **visa** in person at the relevant German embassy in your home country. If a visa is required, you must not have reached the age of 35.
- The **fast-track skilled worker procedure** must be handled through us as your employer. This will result in **non-refundable costs** for you. For your own sake, please ensure you are well informed in advance about the amount of these costs.

Training content

Nursing processes & assessment: Identifying care needs, drawing up care plans, implementation, analysis and evaluation of care.

Practical nursing tasks: Personal hygiene, wound care, measuring blood pressure/temperature, taking blood samples, preparing infusions.

Medical care: Preparing and administering medication, assisting doctors.

Counselling & communication: counselling patients and relatives, interaction within multidisciplinary teams.

Law & ethics: legal framework, ethical conduct in nursing.

Quality management: ensuring quality in medical care.

The training concludes with a state examination comprising a written, an oral and a practical component.

What you can expect from us

- With around 150 staff members, we are one of the largest care providers in Wuppertal.
- We offer variety as an outpatient care service¹ and with soon to be nine dementia care homes²: 'Wohnen in Elberfeld', 'Wohnen in Ronsdorf' and, from 2027, 'Wohnen in Vohwinkel'.

¹ An outpatient care service visits people in their own homes and provides care there.

² In a dementia shared accommodation scheme, or 'dementia shared house' for short, people living with dementia live together. 'Dementia' means that people are increasingly losing their memories and abilities. Everyone has their own room with their own furniture and mementos, but there is also a communal kitchen, balcony/terrace and garden for everyone to use. In their daily lives, they are supported by care staff. The nursing tasks are carried out by Talpflege carers.
